#### 1. INTRODUCTION (headlines: Times New Roman Bold, 12pt)

Please omit detailed information and avoid very long paragraphs.

Authors are requested to submit an extended abstract not exceeding three (3) pages in English or Turkish. Submitted abstract must not have been published anywhere before and should not be entered into the evaluation process for publication elsewhere. The scientific responsibility of the extended abstract belongs to the author(s).

Describe the problem/system being studied and methodology applied. The methodology must be clearly stated and described in sufficient detail or with sufficient references.

## 3. **RESULT AND DISCUSSION (headlines: Times New Roman, Bold, 12pt)**

Result and Discussion: The findings and arguments of the work should be explicitly described and illustrated.

All the tables, images and figures should be centered. Place the table title above the table and the figure caption below the figure. Each table and figure should be cited in the text (e.g., Figure 1, Table 1); and placed as close as possible to the text to which they refer. Do not



reduce figures or tables to a size that is difficult to read. Please make sure there is no copyright issue with the photos/figures.

Equations should be centered and numbered consecutively, as in Equation (1). Use SI units only. Equations should be typed (**please do not paste the equations as pictures**). In the text, an equation should be referred to an equation number, e.g., Equation (1). **Please use a dot as decimal separator and comma as thousand separator**. Align each equation left and the Equation number to the right. Allow single spacing above and below equations, as:
